


This Traffic Volume Database includes Average Daily Traffic (ADT) data from traffic counts performed by MassDOT and Berkshire Regional Planning Commission from 1977 - 2011 at various locations throughout Berkshire County.

Average Daily Traffic (ADT) represents the average annual 24 hour traffic volume. ADT counts are adjusted using seasonal correction factors supplied by MassDOT.

HOW TO FILTER THE DATA TO VIEW DATA FROM SPECIFIC TOWNS:

Rather than scroll through the entire database, you may choose to view data from specific towns by using the "filter" arrows next to each column header. The "filter arrows" look like this: 

1. Click the filter arrow next to the "Town" column header.
2. You will see an "Autofilter" pull down menu that includes a list of all the towns in Berkshire County.
3. Click on the box next to the (Select All) filter at the top of the list to erase the check-mark. This will erase the check-marks next to all of the Town names. Older versions of Excel may not include the "Select All" filter and/or the check-mark boxes. In this case, simply choose the name of the Town from the list provided.
4. Scroll through the Town names and select the specific Towns for which you would like to see data by clicking on the boxes next to the Town names. This will cause check-marks to reappear.
5. Click "OK"
6. Once the data from a specific town appears, the "filter arrows" may be used to choose specific locations.

NOTE: To make the AutoFilter menu wider or longer, click and drag the grip handle at the bottom righthand corner of the pull down menu.

Please note that traffic counts performed at municipal boundaries may be listed in either community. For example, traffic counts on Holmes Road in Pittsfield may be classified as a Pittsfield OR a Lenox count. Please check under each municipality to review all available data from counts performed at municipal boundaries.
